RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ACCEPTANCE OF A BID FOR CONTRACT NO. 8: TELESCOPING BLEACHERS FOR THE JOHNSON CITY CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT'S CAPITAL PROJECT

WHEREAS, the Board of Education (the "Board") of the Johnson City Central School District (the "District"), at a District Meeting of the qualified voters of the District on December 5, 2018, was authorized to undertake a capital project which would consist of the construction of additions, reconstruction and construction of improvements to District facilities in and for said District, including sports fields and other site improvements, original furnishings, equipment, machinery, apparatus, appurtenances, and incidental improvements and expenses in connection therewith (the "Capital Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Board determined itself to be lead agency for the purposes of the State Environmental Quality Review Act, ("SEQRA"), declared the Capital Project to be a Type I action, and determined that the implementation of which as proposed would not result in a significant environmental impact; and

WHEREAS, at a regular meeting of the Board on January 8, 2019 the Board approved the Capital Project along with certain expenditures and bonding related thereto; and

WHEREAS, the District previously awarded a Piggybacking proposal for Contract No. 8, but said award was rescinded due to issues regarding the underlying Piggybacking authorization; and

WHEREAS, the District solicited sealed competitive bids for Contract No. 8, with said bids being returnable to the District Clerk's Office to be publicly opened and read;

WHEREAS, Acme Stage & Sports Specialties, Inc. did submit the lowest responsible bid for Contract No. 8: Telescoping Bleachers, without alternates, for the sum total amount of \$237,219.00;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the Johnson City Central School District, after review and discussion, and upon the recommendation of the Capital Project Committee and the Design Team, Highland

Associates and Hulbert Engineering, hereby approves Acme Stage and Sports Specialties, Inc.'s bid for Contract No. 8: Telescoping Bleachers as set forth herein; and be it

PRELIMINARY CLASSIFICATION OF AN ENERGY PERFORMANCE CONTRACT PURSUANT TO THE STATE ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY REVIEW ACT

WHEREAS, the Johnson City Central School District (the "District") Board of Education (the "Board") is considering the construction of an approximately 10 acre, 3.9 MW solar project to be completed at 1200 Reynolds Road, Johnson City, New York 13790 (the "Proposed Action"). The Proposed Action shall include, but is not limited to, construction of the solar project, site work, interconnection work, and other related, incidental, and accessory construction of facilities; and

WHEREAS, the Board has reviewed the Proposed Action with respect to the Type I and II criteria set forth in 6 NYCRR Parts 617.4(b) and 617.5(c) and preliminarily concluded that the Scope of Work qualifies as a Type I action, thereby requiring coordinated review among involved agencies for purposes of the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA); and

WHEREAS, the Board directs preparation of Part 1 of the Full Environmental Assessment Form (FEAF) to be prepared regarding the Proposed Action, and that such FEAF be sent to any involved agencies for review and comment;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the District as follows:

1. The Proposed Action is preliminarily classified as a Type I Action.

- 2. The Board hereby declares lead agency status for the Proposed Action.
- 3. The Board hereby directs preparation of Part 1 of the FEAF.
