Tammy Maas was a tremendous basketball player for Johnson City High School. She was an integral part of the 1985 NYSPHSAA State Championship team. She also competed and earned Varsity letters in field hockey and softball, but basketball was her claim to fame.

Tammy's impressive career spanned three years as a starter on the Varsity. Her sophomore year she was selected to the Windsor tournament All-tourney Team and led her JC squad in Free Throw, but her junior year is when she blossomed into an elite basketball player.

Tammy was the team's MVP, repeated as Windsor Tourney All-tourney Team, Susquehanna Classic All-Tourney Team, All-STAC, All-Metro, NY State All-Tourney Team, NY State Third Team All-Star, USA Today All-American Honorable Mention, Athlete of the Week and let STAC and the Southern Tier area in scoring (18.4 points per game).

Tammy improved on her scoring her senior season. She averaged 21 points per game, had 51% shooting average, 66% free-throw average. Once again, she was named to the Windsor Tourney All-Tourney Team as well as MVP, JC team MVP, All-Metro, All-STAC.

She also scored her 1,000th career point for JC without the benefit of a 3-point basket! Maas earned the nickname "Clutch" because whenever the pressure was on, she came through in a big way. A quiet confident leader, she was respected and admired by teammates, opponents and coaches.

Tammy accepted a full basketball scholarship to Utica College and completed her career at SUNY Cortland. She currently is a successful administrator in the Arizona school system.
