## RESOLUTION

At a regular meeting of the Board of Education of Johnson City Central School District held in the Board Room at the Johnson City Senior High School, 666 Reynolds Road, Johnson City, New York, on March 8, 2022 at 7:00 p.m.

The following resolution was offered by Board Member \_\_\_\_\_.

### RESOLVED:

1. That the Annual Meeting and Election of the qualified voters of Johnson City Central School District shall be held on May 17, 2022 between the hours of 12 noon and 8 p.m.
2. That pursuant to Education Law Section 2035, voting machines or in the absence of same, paper ballots, shall be used for recording the vote at the Annual Meeting and Election for two members of the Board of Education and the annual budget and to vote on any propositions which may legally be considered, including a Proposition to purchase two 66 passenger buses and one 64 passenger wheelchair-accessible bus, for an aggregate total cost of \$434,430.91 and a Proposition for the purchase of one 64 passenger electric bus for a cost not to exceed \$364,095.80 as more particularly described in the Notice set forth hereafter.
3. That said Annual Meeting and Election shall be held in the single, consolidated Election District heretofore established for said School District and hereby affirmed as described in Section 10 of this resolution.
4. That a public hearing on the budget, as adopted by the Board of Education, shall be held on May 10, 2022 at 7:00 p.m. at the Johnson City Senior High School, and a detailed statement of the amount of money which will be required for the ensuing year for school purposes, specifying the several purposes and the amount for each, and also the amount for each purpose estimated necessary for payments to Boards of Cooperative Educational Services shall be shown in full, with no deduction of estimated State Aid, may be obtained by any taxpayer from the District Business Office within the District between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. on and after April 26, 2022 (excluding Saturdays, Sundays and holidays).
5. That the business to be acted on at said Annual Meeting and Election shall be as follows:
  - a) To vote on the annual district budget for the school year commencing July 1, 2022 and ending June 30, 2023, as adopted by the Board of Education, to appropriate the

necessary funds required to meet the expenditures and to authorize the levy of taxes therefore (exclusive of public monies).

b) To elect two members of the Board of Education as follows:

(1) two members of the Board of Education for a five (5) year term, commencing July 1, 2022 and ending June 30, 2027 to fill the expiring terms of Nicholas Matyas and Richard Martinez.

c) To vote on any proposition which may legally be considered including a vote on the following proposition:

PROPOSITION NO. 1

(a) That the Board of Education of the Johnson City Central School District, Broome County, New York, is hereby authorized to purchase and to expend therefore, including costs incidental thereto and the financing thereof, an amount not to exceed the estimated maximum cost of \$434,430.91 for the following vehicles:

(1) Two (2) 66 passenger buses and one (1) 64 passenger wheelchair-accessible bus and incidentals thereto at a maximum aggregate cost of \$434,430.91.

(b) That a tax is hereby voted therefore in the aggregate sum of not to exceed \$434,430.91 to be levied and collection in annual installments in such years and in such amounts as may be determined by the Board of Education.

(c) That in anticipation of said tax, bonds of the School District are hereby authorized to be issued in the aggregate principal sum of \$434,430.91 and a tax is hereby voted to pay the principal and interest on said bonds as the same shall become due and payable.

PROPOSITION NO. 2

(a) That the Board of Education of the Johnson City Central School District, Broome County, New York, is hereby authorized to purchase and to expend therefore, including costs incidental thereto and the financing thereof, an amount not to exceed the estimated maximum cost of \$364,095.80 for the following vehicle:

(1) One (1) 64 passenger electric bus and incidentals thereto at a maximum cost not to exceed \$364,095.80.

(b) That a tax is hereby voted therefore in a sum not to exceed \$364,095.80 to be levied and collection in annual installments in such years and in such amounts as may be determined by the Board of Education.

(c) That in anticipation of said tax, bonds of the School District are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal sum of \$364,095.80 and a tax is hereby voted to pay the principal and interest on said bonds as the same shall become due and payable.

6. All votes shall be by voting machines or in the absence of same, paper ballots and the District Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to have the necessary arrangements for voting machine or ballot box voting in the form and manner corresponding as nearly as may be with the requirements of Section 2035 of the Education Law.

7. The polls in each Election District shall be open from 12 noon to 8 p.m. on May 17, 2022, and as much longer as may be necessary to enable the voters then present to cast their ballots.

8. NOTICE IS ALSO GIVEN, that the Board of Education, at the regular meeting on October 12, 1999, implemented a procedure for absentee ballots for school district meetings and elections in accordance with Education Law Section 2018-a. Applications for absentee ballots may be applied for at the Office of the District clerk, 666 Reynolds Road, Johnson City, New York. A request for an application must be received by the District Clerk or a designee of the Board of Education at least seven (7) days before said vote if the ballot is to be mailed to the absentee voter or by the date before if the ballot is to be delivered personally to said absentee voter. Absentee ballots must be received by the District Clerk or designee not later than 5 p.m. on the day of the vote.

9. NOTICE IS ALSO GIVEN, that a list of all persons to whom absentee ballots shall have been issued shall be available for public inspection at the District Offices, 666 Reynolds Road, Johnson City, New York on each of the five business days prior to the election. Such list shall also be posted in a conspicuous place during the election for inspection.

10. For the purposes of the Annual Meeting and Election, the School District is comprised of one consolidated Election District, as heretofore determined by the Board of Education and affirmed hereby, which Election District is coterminous with the entire Johnson City Central School District.

11. The register of the qualified voters of said School District prepared and

maintained by the Broome County Board of Elections, shall be used to determine those residents who shall be entitled to vote at said Annual Meeting and Election.

12. The candidates for office as a member of the Board of Education must be nominated by petition.

Petitions nominating candidates as a member of the Board of Education must be directed to the District Clerk, shall be signed by at least 25 qualified voters of the District or 2% of the voters who voted in the previous Annual Election on May 18, 2021, whichever is greater, and shall state the residence of each signer. Each petition shall state the name and residence of the candidate who is being nominated for a member of the Board of Education.

Said petitions nominating candidates shall be filed with the District Clerk not later than the thirtieth day preceding the Annual Meeting and Election, to wit, April 18, 2022, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4 p.m.

Position of candidates on the ballot shall be by a drawing by lot to be held on April 19, 2022 at 4:00 p.m.

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that pursuant to a rule adopted by the Board of Education in accordance with Sections 2035 and 2008 of the Education Law, any referenda or propositions to amend the budget, or otherwise to be submitted for voting at said election, must be filed with the District Clerk, on or before April 18, 2022 at 4 p.m. prevailing time; must be typed or printed in the English language; must be directed to the Clerk of the School District; must be signed by at least twenty-five (25) qualified voters of the District or 2% of the number of actual voters from the previous election, whichever is greater; and must state the name and residence of each signer. However, the School Board will not entertain any petition to place before the power of the voters to determine, or any proposition which failed to include a specific appropriation where the expenditures of monies is required by the proposition.

13. Pursuant to the provisions of the Education Law, Nicholas Matyas, a qualified voter of the Johnson City Central School District, is hereby appointed to act as the Permanent Chairman of the Annual Meeting and Election to be held on May 17, 2022 and the District Clerk is hereby appointed District Clerk of said Annual Meeting and Election and is hereby authorized and directed to give written notice of the appointment of such qualified voters so appointed by this Board of Education.

14. Pursuant to the provisions of the Education Law, Jeannette Farr, a qualified voter of the District, is hereby appointed to act as the Acting Clerk at said Annual Meeting and Election, in the absence of the District Clerk.

15. The Chief Election Inspector, to be appointed by the Board of Education, shall, within twenty-four (24) hours after the Annual Meeting and Election, report the results of the balloting in the Election District to the District Clerk setting forth the names of each candidate receiving votes and the number of votes cast for each candidate running for member of the Board of Education, together with the number of votes cast and a tally of the votes in favor of and against the budget and the number of votes cast and a tally of the votes in favor of and against any propositions.

16. The Board of Education of the District shall, within twenty-four (24) hours after the filing with the District Clerk of such results of the balloting, meet at the Johnson City Senior High School in said School District, for the purpose of examining and tabulating said reports of the results of the balloting and to declare the result of the balloting.

17. The District Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to give notice of the Annual Meeting and Election by publishing the same in the Press & Sun-Bulletin, a newspaper having a general circulation within the School District, said publication thereof to be made four times within the seven weeks next preceding said Annual Meeting and Election, the first publication to be at least forty-five days before said Annual Meeting and Election.

18. That the Notice of the Annual Meeting and Election of the qualified voters shall be in substantially the following form:

The Annual District Meeting and Election shall be held for the following purposes:

- a) To vote on the annual district budget for the School year commencing July 1, 2022 and ending June 30, 2023, as adopted by the Board of Education, to appropriate the necessary funds

required to meet the expenditures and to authorize the levy of taxes therefore (exclusive of public monies).

b) To elect two members of the Board of Education for a five (5) year term, commencing July 1, 2022 and ending June 30, 2027 to fill the expiring terms of Nicholas Matyas and Richard Martinez.

c) To vote on the following propositions:

(a) That the Board of Education of the Johnson City Central School District, Broome County, New York, is hereby authorized to purchase and to expend therefore, including costs incidental thereto and the financing thereof, an amount not to exceed the estimated maximum cost of \$434,430.91 for the following vehicles:

(1) Two (2) 66 passenger buses and one (1) 64 passenger wheelchair-accessible bus and incidentals thereto at a maximum aggregate cost of \$434,430.91.

(b) That a tax is hereby voted therefore in the aggregate sum of not to exceed \$434,430.91 to be levied and collection in annual installments in such years and in such amounts as may be determined by the Board of Education.

(c) That in anticipation of said tax, bonds of the School District are hereby authorized to be issued in the aggregate principal sum of \$434,430.91, and a tax is hereby voted to pay the principal and interest on said bonds as the same shall become due and payable.

PROPOSITION NO. 2

Shall the following resolution be adopted, to-wit:

RESOLVED:

(a) That the Board of Education of the Johnson City Central School District, Broome



County, New York, is hereby authorized to purchase and to expend therefore, including costs incidental thereto and the financing thereof, an amount not to exceed the estimated maximum cost of \$364,095.80 for the following vehicle:

(1) One (1) 64 passenger electric bus and incidentals thereto at a maximum cost not to exceed \$364,095.80.

(b) That a tax is hereby voted therefore in a sum not to exceed \$364,095.80 to be levied and collection in annual installments in such years and in such amounts as may be determined by the Board of Education.

(c) That in anticipation of said tax, bonds of the School District are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal sum of \$364,095.80, and a tax is hereby voted to pay the principal and interest on said bonds as the same shall become due and payable.

Voting machines or in the absence of same, paper ballots will be used for recording the vote on the budget and the election of one member of the Board of Education and any propositions:

The School District is comprised of one single consolidated Election District and voting is held in the Senior High School.

A public hearing on the budget, as adopted by the Board of Education, shall be held on May 10, 2022 at 7:00 p.m. in the evening of said day, at the Johnson City Senior High School, 666 Reynolds Road, Johnson City, New York, and a detailed statement of the amount of money which will be required for the ensuing school year for school purposes, specifying the several purposes and the amount for each, and also the amount for each purpose estimated necessary for payments to Boards of Cooperation Educational Services shall be shown in full, with no deduction of estimated State Aid, may be obtained by any taxpayer from the District Business Office within the District between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. on and after April 26, 2022 (excluding Saturdays, Sundays and holidays).

The polls will be open from 12 noon to 8 p.m. on May 17, 2022, and as much longer as may be necessary to enable the voters then present to cast their ballots.

NOTICE IS ALSO GIVEN, that the Board of Education, at the regular meeting on

October 12, 1999, implemented a procedure for absentee ballots for school district meetings and elections in accordance with Education Law Section 2018-a. Applications for absentee ballots may be applied for at the Office of the District clerk, 666 Reynolds Road, Johnson City, New York. A request for an application must be received by the District Clerk or a designee of the Board of Education at least seven (7) days before said vote if the ballot is to be mailed to the absentee voter or by the date before if the ballot is to be delivered personally to said absentee voter. Absentee ballots must be received by the District Clerk or designee not later than 4 p.m. on the day of the vote.

NOTICE IS ALSO GIVEN, that a list of all persons to whom absentee ballots shall have been issued shall be available for public inspection at the District Offices, 666 Reynolds Road, Johnson City, New York on each of the five business days prior to the election. Such list shall also be posted in a conspicuous place during the election for inspection.

The register of the qualified voters of said School District prepared and maintained by the Broome County Board of Elections and shall be used to determine those residents who shall be entitled to vote at said Annual Meeting and Election. No person shall be entitled to vote at said election whose name does not appear on said register.

TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that candidates for office as a member of the Board of Education must be nominated by petition.

Petitions nominating candidates as a member of the Board of Education must be directed to the District Clerk, shall be signed by at least 25 qualified voters of the District or 2% of the voters who voted in the previous Annual Election on May 18, 2021, whichever is greater, and shall state the residence of each signer. Each petition shall state the name and residence of the candidate who is being nominated for a member of the Board of Education.

Said petitions nominating candidates shall be filed with the District Clerk not later than the thirtieth day preceding the Annual Meeting and Election, to wit, April 18, 2022, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4 p.m.

Position of candidates on the ballot shall be determined by drawing by lot to be held on April 19, 2022 at 4:00 p.m.

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that pursuant to a rule adopted by the Board of Education in accordance with Sections 2035 and 2008 of the Education Law, any referenda or propositions to amend the budget, or otherwise to be submitted for voting at said

election, must be filed with the District Clerk, on or before April 18, 2022 at 4 p.m. prevailing time; must be typed or printed in the English language; must be directed to the Clerk of the School District; must be signed by at least twenty-five (25) qualified voters of the District or 2% of the number of actual voters from the previous election, whichever is greater; and must state the name and residence of each signer. However, the School Board will not entertain any petition to place before the power of the voters to determine, or any proposition which failed to include a specific appropriation where the expenditures of monies is required by the proposition.
