REPORT - SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

A. INSTRU- Mr. Jeff Smith, Social Studies Coordinator, updated the board regarding
 TIONAL grading policies, work to align assessments to changing Regents exams,
 REPORT changes to help students interact with content, a new AP Micro Economics
 course coming for 2022-23, impacts of the pandemic on student performance,
 reading and writing deficiencies, and plans to address these impacts.

C. BOARD Budget Committee: Elisa Eaton presented the first report outlining the
 COMMITTEE 2022-23 budget. She discussed goals, budget development, draft revenue
 REPORTS projections, personnel budget expenditures, two propositions and two board
 seats to be presented to voters on May 17.

Culture & Climate Committee: The committee discussed the hugely successful
 and well attended Culture Night. Students were excited and proud to share
 their culturally diverse traditions with everyone in attendance. They discussed
 the overwhelmingly positive feedback regarding Superintendent’s Day events.

Technology Committee: The committee discussed the new fire wall appliance
 installed to improve cyber security. The auditorium projector project will be
 completed by September 1, and the MS PA system will be completed by spring
 break. The Districtwide Technology Plan required by SED every three years
 will be forthcoming for board approval before submission.

Cocurricular Committee: The committee met with Mr. Carbone to discuss the
 interface between athletics and music programs as it relates to student
 participation, which is working well this school year. The committee
 recommends discontinuing admission charges for basketball and wrestling
 competitions. The board agreed to this suggestion. They also discussed the
 state-wide pilot of girls flag football as a club-style program and the
 appointment of a strength & conditioning coach in July through UHS.
